Wildlife Corridors:

Native Ecosystems of NE Kansas include:

- Oak savannah
- Mixed-grass and tall-grass prairies
- Creeks, streams, rivers and riparian zones
- Wetlands and watersheds
- Oak-Hickory deciduous forest

Wildlife and Ecological Relationships:

HABITAT: food → water → shelter → air → SPACE
