### How to plant a berry bush or vine ...

Plant top of root ball 1-2" above surround grade.

Add a 2-4" layer of mulch. Do not bury stems or trunk.

Loosen outer roots after removing from container.

Grade.

Backfill with existing soil. If amending soil add no more than 50% compost to prevent hardpan barrier. Water in thoroughly to eliminate air pockets.

Break down sides of the hole when backfilling. Leave soil under root ball undisturbed to reduce settling.

Width of hole should be 3 times root ball diameter.

Espoma Bio-tone Starter Plus can be added when planting.

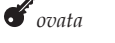

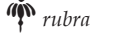

1 These trees make the best pollination partners.

\* Triploid apple trees must be planted with a pollinator. The triploid trees do not pollinate other trees, so the pollinator tree for the triploid will need an appropriate partner to cross pollinate. Why bother with them? Because they are highly resistant to fireblight, cedar apple rust, scab, and powdery mildew.

Apple trees should ideally be planted within 50 feet of each other for effective cross-pollination.

## How to plant a fruit tree ...

Remove trunk wrap

CONTAINERS: remove pot  
B&B: fold down wire basket  
after root ball is placed.  
Remove plastic ties.

Add 2-4" of mulch — keep  
about 6" from the trunk.

Backfill with  
existing  
soil. If  
amending  
soil add no  
more than 50%  
compost to  
prevent hardpan  
barrier. Water in  
thoroughly to  
eliminate air  
pockets.

Loosen outer  
roots after  
removing from  
container.

Espoma Bio-tone  
Starter Plus can  
be added when  
planting.

Low tree branches are  
temporary but help promote  
strong trunks. Remove only  
dead or broken branches  
when planting. Prune only  
after tree is established.

Bud graft (if applicable)  
must be above soil.

Root collar should be 1-2"  
above the finished grade  
of the surrounding soil.

Grade

Break  
down sides  
of the hole when  
backfilling.

Leave soil under root ball undisturbed to reduce settling.

Width of hole should be 3 times  
root ball diameter.

Stake trees only if necessary. Use hose-wrapped wire to  
secure trunk to stakes halfway up the height of the tree. Allow the tree to  
move a little — not too tight. Remove stakes after one year.

## **P** PERENNIAL HERBS

Parsley is biennial (seeds in second year).

Rosemary and sage require sharp drainage to survive our winters.

Plant basil outside when nighttime temperatures are in the 60s.

Dill, cilantro, and parsley love cool weather and can be planted out mid March. Allow some dill and cilantro to self seed for summer crop.

Borage, thyme, and basil are excellent companions plants for tomatoes.
